The Annual Junior Faculty Forum for International Law hosts its inaugural event at the New York University School of Law on May 29 and May 30, 2012. Designed as an annual feature of the international law calendar, the Forum will be convened each year by Professors Dino Kritsiotis (University of Nottingham), Anne Orford (University of Melbourne), and J.H.H. Weiler (New York University). It is aimed at bringing together junior faculty working in the field of international law in order that their work can be presented before an audience of peers and experts and then discussed by established and senior scholars of the discipline. These junior faculty shall be selected through an open and competitive international process held every summer, and shall be asked to work up the abstracts they have submitted as part of that process into presentations for the Forum. The initiative is thus dedicated toward encouraging and facilitating the work of young international law scholars by creating a unique environment of intellectual opportunity, stimulation and exchange. Selected presentations from the inaugural Forum will be published in a special edition of the *European Journal of International Law* (Oxford University Press).

The second Forum will be held in May 2013 at the University of Nottingham and, in May 2014, members of the third Forum will convene at the University of Melbourne.
